STUDENT REGISTRATION

- Please complete your Annual Updates online for the 2023-24 school year.
 - All families with students who completed the 2022-23 school year can access the Parent Portal to submit the annual information update. It is important that all families complete the annual data updates through the Parent Portal to ensure the district has the most accurate information in Infinite Campus.
- Additional information, including a guide for families to complete their annual updates online, can be found at gbaps.org/registration.
- Parents without a Parent Portal account can contact the Help Desk at (920) 448-2148, or if email is an option, it would be preferred that parents email servicedesk@qbaps.org from the email they have on record with the district.
- We must have the student's birth certificate on file in order to set up a parent portal.

DROP-OFF PROCEDURES

THE SCHOOL DAY: 8:57 A.M.-3:30 P.M.

- Supervision will begin at 8:45 a.m. Please DO NOT drop students off prior to 8:45 a.m. The only exceptions are for 4K students or those participating in the breakfast program which begins at 8:30 a.m.
- All students must be dropped off <u>on</u> Hobart Drive. Cars will <u>not</u> be permitted to enter the parking lot.
- All students must wait outside until the doors open at 8:53 a.m., when the first bell rings.
- Students will not be allowed to play before or after school.
- After the second bell rings at 8:57 a.m., only the main door (Door #1) will be accessible.

BUS RIDING PROCEDURES

- The transportation tab on the parent portal will be activated for parents to view their students' transportation details the week of August 21st. From the parent portal, click on More>Transportation.
- All eligible bus riders will receive notification from our district transportation office with the scheduled pick-up and drop-off times.
- We encourage all eligible bus riders to use the bus service.
- Please refer to the <u>Transportation page of the GBAPS Website</u> for information on transportation, eligibility, access to request forms, etc.
- .My Stop Bus App Consider downloading this app. If a student has bus transportation, the username can be found on the Transportation tab of the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Note: the app only displays information when the bus is actually en route.
- Bus transportation questions should be directed to the Green Bay Area Public School District Transportation office at 448-2130.

WALKING/BIKING PROCEDURES

- A bike rack is available on the west side of the building near Hobart Drive. The school does not supply bike locks.
- All students must stay on the sidewalks until they reach the playground area.
- Contact our district transportation office at 448-2130 if interested in learning about paying for bussing.

PICK-UP PROCEDURES

- School dismisses at 3:30 p.m. All students must be picked up promptly.
- If picking up or meeting your child at the end of the school day, please choose an area for your child to meet you outside of the building.
- Your child may have to walk around the building to pick up/meet up with siblings.
- A student dismissal form will be sent home for you to indicate your child's daily and emergency weather-related dismissal plans. If your dismissal plans change, please communicate the change with your child's teacher. If you have an emergent change, you can contact the school office at 492-2680 prior to 3:00 p.m.
- Please call the office <u>at least 30 minutes before the end of the day</u> with any after school changes. We cannot guarantee your child will get the message if you call after 3:00 p.m.

Let's all do our part to keep our kids safe!

Please remember to slow down near a school zone when children are present!



ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

K-5: 8:57-3:30 p.m.

4K: 8:40-11:45 a.m.

Monday-Thursday (No 4K on Fridays)

School attendance is required by law. Students must attend school daily unless excused for illness, injury, or serious emergency. Please plan your vacations accordingly.

A parent must notify the school office before 8:30 a.m. <u>each day</u> their child is absent. This would include any occasion that would prevent your child from starting school at 8:57 a.m. Please call the school at **492-2680**.

If notice is not received, we will assume your child should be in school and you will receive an automated phone call inquiring about your child's absence. This is a safety procedure for your child's protection, so please be sure to contact us before 8:30 a.m. to avoid unnecessary calls to your home or work place.

TARDY STUDENTS

- Students arriving at school after 8:57 a.m. will enter the building through the front doors.
- If a child misses less than 2 hours of the school day it will be recorded as a tardy.
- Time missed greater than 2 hours will be recorded as either an excused or unexcused absence. Decisions regarding whether or not an absence is excused or unexcused is dependent upon reasons provided by the parent/guardian:
 - For example, absences for medical/dental appointments would be considered excused. For these absences, we ask that an excuse from a medical professional be provided to the school so the absence can be coded correctly.

EARLY PICKUP

- If a parent wishes to pick up their child during the school day, the parent must sign the child out in the school office.
- **Upon your arrival,** the school secretary will call your child from the classroom to meet you in the office.
- It is always a good idea to send a note with your child in advance so the teacher can plan appropriately for your child.
- Should your child return before the school day is complete, he/she must be signed in at the office and a pass will be provided to permit re-entrance to school.

PRE-EXCUSED ABSENCES

- If an extended absence (of 3 or more days) is planned, please contact the main office (492-2680) for a Pre-Excused Absence Form.
- The form should be filled out at least one week prior to the absence.
- The form should be completed, returned to the office, and subsequently approved by the building principal. This prearranged absence form will suffice as a written excuse for the absence.

TRUANCY

According to State law, any child missing all or part of any school day without an
acceptable excuse is considered truant and may be subject to disciplinary action.



What parents can do to HELP

If your child will be absent, contact the main office each morning to explain the reason.


Positive habits should be encouraged at an early age. Make certain that your child attends school regularly, arrives on time, and obeys school rules.

Time missed greater than 2 hours will be recorded as either an excused or unexcused absence. Decisions regarding whether or not an absence is excused or unexcused is dependent upon reasons provided by the parent/guardian:

 For example, absences for medical/dental appointments would be considered excused. For these absences, we ask that an excuse from a medical professional be provided to the school so the absence can be coded correctly.

Expect strong support from the school as you establish family practices that promote school attendance.

The Green Bay Area Public School District is reminding you that if your child displays symptoms such as: fever of 100.4+, vomiting, or diarrhea, please keep your child home from school. They can return when they are symptom free without medication for 24 hours.



BREAKFAST & LUNCH

- <u>ALL</u> students regardless of free and reduced status can eat breakfast and lunch <u>FREE</u>.
- Breakfast will be served in the gym beginning at 8:30 a.m.
- Students are to enter at door #12 upon arrival.
- Parents are invited to visit for meals but should make reservations through the school office before 9:00 a.m. if they will be purchasing a school lunch.
 - Payment for visitor meals may be paid for in the main office.
- Menus Our menu continues to be available through NutriSlice, <u>click here</u> for the
 website, then click on "MacArthur" and look for the school year programs. Please
 note we expect to encounter many supply chain and product availability barriers
 this year. NutriSlice is the most up-to-date resource to use for the expected menu
 and is updated for each site when changes occur. NutriSlice filters can be applied
 for special dietary needs.
- <u>Food Allergies & Special Dietary Needs</u> families with children impacted by food allergies and/or dietary accommodations should work with the school nurse. Then the nurse will work with our registered dietitian. Visit our website for more information, <u>click here</u>.

WAIVER OF FEES

- The school waiver application and free lunch application are the same form.
- Lunch waiver forms and notification of pre-approval for free or reduced lunch were sent to each home in the mail.
- Please contact the school if you did not receive a form or notification if you would like to apply for free lunch or waived fees.
- Only one form should be filled out per family. Include all children and the schools they are attending. If you qualify for free lunch you will qualify for free fees.
- PLEASE complete this form; it's one of the reasons why <u>ALL</u> MacArthur students get free breakfast and lunch this year.

STUDENT DIRECTORY

- According to the Green Bay Public School District, directory data refers to a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, and the name of the school most recently attended by the student.
- This data shall be considered public information and may be released to appropriate persons and media unless parents/guardians complete the <u>Denial of</u> <u>Release-Directory Opt Out Form</u> returned on or before September 23, 2023.
- Opt Out <u>does not</u> apply to video or photography of events by individuals not employed by or acting on behalf of the District or media. See the <u>Denial of</u> <u>Release - Media</u> for more information.



PBIS

What is PBIS?

 PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) is a school-wide commitment to teaching students appropriate behavior, acknowledging them when they get it right, and supporting them when they don't.

The PBIS process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. Common routines and uniform language with respect to appropriate school behaviors are consistent throughout the school. As a result, instructional time is more effectively used for teaching and the overall school environment is calm, pleasant and conducive to learning.

- Our school wide expectations lay the foundation for student success in all school settings.

S – Self Control

O - On Task

A – (Positive) **A**ttitude

R – Respect

 On a <u>weekly</u> basis, one student from each classroom is presented with the Eagle Eye Award by the principal, Ms. Van Pay. The Eagle Eye Award recognizes the way a student is following the behavior expectations at MacArthur Elementary School.

STUDENT EXPECTATION BOOKS

 Parent(s)/guardian(s) will receive an electronic communication from the District which will include the annual Student Expectation Book. Each family is required to electronically acknowledge receipt of the Student Expectation Book for each student enrolled in the District. For any families who may not be able to access the electronic version, they may contact their student's school to request a paper copy.







VISITORS, VOLUNTEERS AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS

- Visitors, volunteers, and community partners will be allowed on school campuses at the District's discretion.
- All volunteers who are coming to school to volunteer, will need to have a background check on file via Volunteer Tracker.
- All volunteers are required to complete and pass a background check <u>prior</u> to beginning volunteering.
- All volunteers, including volunteers coming into the building through community partnership (i.e. Reading Coaches, etc). must sign in and out using Volunteer Tracker.
- All visitors, volunteers, and community partners coming indoors are required to check in at the main office.
